COUSBC Jacqueline Kirk-Terrell Queens Tournament Rules – 2025-2026 Season

1. This tournament is open to female USBC members who hold a current USBC membership and have bowled 21+ games in a Cleveland Ohio USBC certified league within the last three seasons (2023-2024, 2024-2025 or 2025-2026). The field is limited to 32 bowlers.
2. Entry fee is \$125.00 (\$105.00 prize fund; \$20.00 lineage). Entry fees may be paid by cash or check/money order payable to Cleveland Ohio USBC (COUSBC). Checks returned for non-sufficient funds (NSF) will be charged a \$35.00 fee plus the amount of the check. Only cash will be accepted for NSF checks. No checks will be accepted after March 30, 2026. There will be no refunds (except for illness; see Rule #13). **A minimum of 16 paid entries must be received in the COUSBC office by March 30, 2026 to avoid possible cancellation of this tournament. In the event there are not enough women to hold the Jacqueline Kirk-Terrell Queens tournament, those entrants will have the option to compete in the Bernie Vozar Masters Tournament.**

3. Tournament Format

- This is a scratch singles tournament with qualifying rounds, match play and stepladder finals.
- Competitors will bowl a 6-game qualifying round with the top 1:4 bowlers advancing to a double-elimination bracket (4, 8, 16, 32 or 64 which will be determined by the number of entries on the day of the event).
- In the event of a tie for the final position needed to complete the field for match play:
 - A 9th and 10th frame roll-off will be bowled on a neutral pair, selected by the tournament director, following the qualifying round.
 - The bowler with the highest qualifying game chooses the starting lane and the bowler on the odd lane will start.
 - Bowlers will have four (4) shots on each lane.
 - If a tie still exists, the bowlers will continue to switch lanes until the tie is broken.
- In the event of a tie for any other position, the tie shall be broken by the highest qualifying game.
- Bowlers who advance to the double-elimination bracket will bowl one (1) game matches. A player is eliminated after two losses.
- Four (4) bowlers will move on to the stepladder finals as follows:
 - The winner in the Winner's Bracket will be the #1 seed.
 - The finalist in the Winner's Bracket will be the #2 seed.
 - The final two (2) bowlers remaining in the Elimination Bracket will be the #3 and #4 seeds based on their final game bowled.
 - If the #1 seed from the Winner's Bracket loses the first game in the championship match, a second game will be bowled to determine the champion.
 - If a match ends in a tie, competitors will compete in a one-ball sudden-death roll-off. The highest-seeded competitor shall determine the starting lane and position for the roll-off. The competitors shall bowl on the same lane and then alternate lanes in the same bowling order until the tie is broken.
- Lanes will be oiled once before the start of the tournament with bracket play and stepladder finals being bowled on the burn.

4. Prize Fund Payout

- The prize ratio will be at least 1:4.
- Those who qualify within the 1:4 ratio but are not seeded in the bracket will earn a cash prize equivalent to their entry fee.
- The IRS requires COUSBC to furnish 1099 forms to individuals who accumulate winnings of \$600 or more annually in any COSUBC event in which they participate. Individuals who fall into this category will be required to complete an IRS W-9 form prior to payout.
- Cash prizes won by youth participants will be deposited into their SMART account. Per Rule 400, youth participants and their parent/legal guardian must sign the USBC Consent Form prior to competition.

5. Check-in will be one (1) hour prior to squad time. Walk-ins are permitted one (1) hour prior to squad time based on lane availability.

6. Eligible substitutes will be permitted to bowl in the tournament.

7. Bowlers arriving after the squad has begun will be permitted to bowl but must begin in the current frame being bowled. All tardy bowlers not ready to bowl when the squad begins will receive zero (0) for all frames missed.

8. Tournament officials will collect money for brackets and jackpots.

9. The entrant whose name appears on this entry, or their authorized replacement, hereby agrees that the COUSBC, its officers and agents shall be liable only to the extent of returning the entry fee if and when this entrant shall be prevented from bowling in the tournament through delay, unexpected yet necessary schedule change, or premature termination of the tournament, which may be brought on by war, national emergency or emergencies caused by unexpected weather conditions or causes relating thereto or resulting therefrom fires, strikes, lockouts, labor difficulties or causes beyond the control of the COUSBC.

10. If a lane equipment malfunction occurs during tournament competition that requires participants to be moved to a new pair of lanes, the participants will start their tournament competition from the point of the interruption with no practice/shadow balls on the new lanes. NOTE: The tournament director / official may authorize participants on the pair to practice prior to resuming the game.

11. ETIQUETTE: Individuals are responsible for their own conduct during tournament competition. Disruptive and unsportsmanlike conduct, profane language and obscene gestures will not be tolerated. Proper attire suitable for this level of competition must be worn. No cut-off shirts, tank tops, spaghetti straps, low-cut tops, bare midriffs, short shorts or cut-offs will be allowed. No obscene printing on anything. Length of skirts, dresses, skorts or shorts must be below the competitor's fingertips when they are standing and their arms are hanging down at their side. Length of skirts, dresses, skorts, and shorts MUST be long enough to not see your bottom area (even if covered by under shorts) at any time, standing or bent over. Tops of shorts/pants must be worn at waist level. One lane courtesy will be observed by bowlers and enforced throughout the tournament. Failure to comply can result in disqualification from tournament competition.

12. Bowling equipment must meet USBC specifications. No balance holes will be permitted. All holes drilled must be used for gripping purposes on every delivery. NOTE: House balls are exempt from this rule. The use of any powder or foreign substance on shoes, on the approach, on the facility floor, on the carpet, or on a bowling towel is not allowed. **Use of all liquids, sprays and sanding pads must be done prior to the first ball of tournament competition.** NOTE: Any cleaner that is used prior to the start of competition must be approved by USBC (refer to the "Approved Cleaners" list in the Equipment Specifications manual on www.bowl.com) and in its original container which displays the USBC Approved Before/After logo. **Once competition has begun, the outer surface of the bowling ball may only be cleaned with a dry towel (USBC Rule 18). (Competition starts once any bowler throws a ball for score in the tournament.)** If a bowler is seen altering the ball surface during the tournament, the ball will be disqualified for the remainder of the tournament as soon as this is discovered. If the bowler incurs a second equipment offense, the bowler will be disqualified from the current event with NO refund of entry fee. NOTE: Should a foreign substance appear on the outer surface of a bowling ball which cannot be removed with a dry towel, an approved cleaner may be used with consent from the tournament manager.

13. **Illness Precautions:** If you are feeling sick, have a fever over 100 degrees or have come in contact with someone who has had a confirmed case of COVID-19 within the last 14 days leading up to this tournament, please contact the COUSBC office to withdraw from the event. You will receive a full refund.

14. Any rule violation will be subject to disqualification. Errors in scoring must be reported immediately. Any protest affecting eligibility or playing rules must be confirmed in writing to the Tournament Manager with 72 hours of the infraction or prior to tournament prizes being paid, whichever occurs first. USBC Rule 303 will apply (Authority of Tournament Management). The Tournament Manager along with the Board of Directors of the Cleveland Ohio USBC will have the right to settle all disputes not covered in the above rules or in USBC rules. All decisions of the Tournament Manager are final, unless an appeal is made in accordance with Rule 329. All USBC rules will apply.
